I. Our School

(I) School Information

1. Brief History

This school was founded by the Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China, in Kwai Chung, 1969, to meet the needs of the community for quality secondary education. With its close ties to Chuen Yuen Church, Chuen Yuen First Primary School, Chuen Yuen Second Primary School and Chuen Yuen Third Primary School, this new school was named Chuen Yuen College.

In 1969, there were four classes in Form One and Form Two. The school had its first Form Five graduates in 1972. In September 1973, CCC Chuen Yuen College started its matriculation classes, in both Arts and Science streams. It then developed to its full capacity as a 24-class grammar school. Later, floating classes were introduced in 1976 in response to the request from the Education Department. During the period from 1978 to 1985, the school also offered special education in some classes.

Mr. Cheung Wan Cha, the founding Principal of the school, retired in August 1983. Ms. Yau Oi Nam, Cheung's successor, migrated to Canada in 1992. Mrs. Lee Shek Yuk Yu then became the third Principal and she left the school in 2001. Mr. Wong Wai Yiu took up the principalship as the fourth Principal of the school in 2001 and he retired in August 2019. Mr. Ip Tin Yau joined service in 2019 and he is the fifth Principal of the school.

2. Present Situation

a) Class Structure and Curriculum

The school is an aided co-ed school with approximately 730 pupils. There are four classes in each form from Form One to Form Six.

The school is a grammar school offering a broad and balanced curriculum. A total of twelve electives are offered in senior forms to meet students' diversified needs. Other than academic subjects, we offer more than twenty clubs and societies to stretch the potential of our students.

b) Administration

The Incorporated Management Committee (IMC) of the school was established in September 2011 to replace the School Management Committee (SMC). The IMC is led by the Supervisor, sponsoring body managers, parent managers, an alumni manager, an independent manager, teacher managers and the Principal. It replaces the role of the SMC to manage the school. The IMC sets the goals and priorities for the school. It also formulates development directives, management policies and the use of resources according to the priorities.

The daily operation of the school is administered by the Executive Committee, which is headed by the Principal and further supported by two vice-principals and the chairpersons of major functional committees, namely: Academic; Discipline; Guidance; Religion; Extra-curricular Activities; Career Guidance and Moral and Civic Education. Regular meetings are called to plan, implement and evaluate the progress of school work.

c) Church Support

The CCC Chuen Yuen Church works closely with the school in religious missions. Rev Cheung Mun Yee serves as the school chaplain to advise the school on evangelical matters. She also helps the school to promote the Gospel among teachers and students on the campus. There are also representatives from CCC Chuen Yuen Church in the IMC of the School.

d) School Facilities

The school is situated in Kwai Chung Estate. It is a six-storey building with about 50,000 square feet. There are twenty-eight classrooms and fourteen special rooms including a multimedia language centre, two computer rooms, four laboratories, a library, a gym room and a big assembly hall. All classrooms and laboratories are air-conditioned and equipped with networked computers, LCD projectors and visualisers. There is also a playground and a car park on the school campus.

II Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns 2024-2025

Major concern A: Enhancing academic success among students

Achievements

Targets

- 1. Students learn how to get smart and stay smart in handling the secondary school curriculum.
 - (a) Teachers acknowledged students' learning regularly.
 - (b) Each department ensured the alignment of the curriculum and assessment.
 - (c) Both appraisal lesson observations and peer lesson observations focused on catering for diversified learning. Professional dialogue on refining / enhancing teaching strategies were made after the lesson observations.
 - (d) Various learning support programmes for gifted students and low achievers were provided. For example, STEAM training course, Core three subjects enrichment classes and consolidation classes, English Debate Team training and Mathematics Team training.
- 2. Junior form students have a solid foundation in academic aspect.
 - (a) Different KLA provided study skills to students with respect to their subject nature.
 - (b) Most departments reviewed the homework policy and provided tiered assignments to match the ability of students.
 - (c) Saturday LaC classes and Core three supplementary classes were conducted for developing students skills in tackling test and examination papers.
 - (d) Cross-subject Language Across Curriculum collaboration with the University of Hong Kong had been completed, including the Mathematics Department, the Geography Department and the History Department and the English Department. The feedback of the collaboration was positive.

Reflection 1. In view of the school examination results, there was significant improvement among Secondary One and Secondary Three students. However, according to the stakeholder survey, student learning outcomes remained stagnant compared to the previous year. Students did not recognize their progress and lacked confidence in their learning abilities. 2. Teachers should continue refining their teaching strategies to enhance students' selfefficacy. 3. Continuous individual academic support, encouragement, and care from teachers are key factors in improving student learning. Feedback and Follow-up 1. Refine the implementation strategy to integrate the BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) scheme effectively. 2. More individualized study programmes should be arranged in weekdays to provide individual academic support, encouragement, and care to students. Students can make

use of their holidays to consolidate their weekdays' learning.

Major concern B: To nurture students to be future leaders of society

- 1. Students will be able to lead a healthy lifestyle physically, socially and psychologically.
- 2. Applying positive psychology to help individuals to flourish in an education setting. Students can better encounter their stress and challenges in daily life, and ultimately to have a flourishing life.
- 3. Students will actively engage in both school and community activities with a strong sense of belonging and devotion.

Achievements

Student support programmes, including religious activities, Moral and Civic Education lessons, leadership training, adventure training, careers programmes, discipline and guidance programmes and extra-curricular programmes have been refined and expanded to promote students' holistic wellbeing and to nurture students with positive values and attitudes. Programmes organized by the Gifted Education Committee and Integrated Education Committee have also been conducted to cater to needs of different students. Feedback from participants was mostly positive.

Numerous measures have been made to encourage students to participate in sports activities. A computer application, 'RoboCoach AI' has been launched in junior forms to encourage students to do physical exercises in their spare time. About 300 students (in two terms) were awarded bonus marks in the subject of Physical Education. The school also joined the "Active Students, Active People" Campaign launched by EDB to promote an active and healthy lifestyle. In addition, an assembly talk on how to develop healthy lifestyle through doing physical exercises was conducted. The opening hours of playground and gym room have been adjusted so as to allow more students to use them. Students were also allowed to wear sports uniform to facilitate them to do physical exercises every day in February 2025.

Various committees and teams worked together to help students and parents enhance their mental health. Formal mental health education has been delivered through assemblies and Moral and Civic Education lessons. Workshops (essential oil acupressure, dog training experience, tea appreciation, music box crafting, miniature bonsai making and outdoor excursions) were conducted, in which all participants agreed that the activity could help

relieve their stress. The Guidance Committee organized three booth events, collaborating with external organizations, to address mental health issues through diverse interactive formats and to build a friendly and supportive school atmosphere. Small support groups were also set up to help participants cope with their personal emotions and pressures. PTA also held a talk and a workshop to help parents address their mental health needs.

Students' engagement in both school and community activities has been strengthened so as to raise their sense of belonging and devotion. Class management activities including interclass competitions were conducted. The elderly service project with the Social Service Department was launched for all forms. Members of the Community Youth Club and the Red Cross Youth paid visits to 50 elderly homes. CYC members also participated in meal preparations for the nursing home and flag selling. Volunteer group led by school social worker effectively built students' confidence and sense of fulfilment. Visits, talks and taster programmes were held to let students know and care more about the outside world. In addition, OLE activities such as Appreciation of Drama, Chinese Opera and Movies were conducted. Besides local trips, exchange tours to mainland China (a total of more than 500 participants) were also held to develop students' sense of belonging to our country and enhance their sense of national identity.

Reflection

Based on evaluations, most programmes were successfully implemented and students' immediate feedback was mostly positive. During the interviews with junior and senior students, students expressed their positive feelings toward school, including smooth adaptation, harmonious relationship with schoolmates, diversified learning opportunities, good sense of belonging and student-teacher relationship. However, figures from School Self Evaluation reflected that there would be room for improvement.

The implementation of positive education needs refinement. In addition to formal programs, individual needs should be catered for. More chances to acquire sense of achievement should be provided. Collaboration between parents and teachers in this aspect could be strengthened.

Students' performance in 'Physical Exercise' remains unsatisfactory. More measures should be devised to facilitate the development of students' habit to participate in sports activities.

The employment of mobile device and reward programs could be directions to explore.

The enhancement of mental health remains a major focus. In addition to formal and informal education, ways to identify students in need should be strengthened. More external resources could be sought to provide professional support.

School and community activities could be more focused so as to raise students' sense of belonging and devotion. Form teachers could strengthen bonds among classmates through tailor-made activities. Community service activities would continue to be a way to build students' satisfaction and to encourage them to serve others as a lifelong devotion.

Feedback and Follow-up

The 3-year development plan provides a broad and comprehensive direction while for 2025-26, it is more appropriate to put more efforts on issues of top priority.

One of the focuses is positive education. Education on positive psychology would be continued through a whole school approach. Training for teachers about positive psychology and how it can be applied in teaching and learning would be arranged. Collaboration with parents would be sought.

In order to foster students' habits to do physical exercises, the use of mobile devices would be implemented to motivate students. Awards would be provided if students show an improvement on doing physical exercises. Other measures, such as provision of sports facilities, organizing sports competitions, flexible wearing of sports uniform, etc. would be continued so as to create a conducive atmosphere for students to join physical activities regularly.

Another important issue is mental health. Formal and informal education on mental health would be continued. In the beginning of the school year, a comprehensive screening would be conducted to identify at-risk students so that early support could be provided. Double Form Teacher System would be formally implemented so as to render more pastoral care to students.

Parents' education on mental health would also be strengthened.

The engagement of students in both school and community activities would be more focused. More students would be required to participate in social service so as to raise the sense of devotion. School activities, at different levels, such as intraclass, interclass, and interhouse, would be conducted to raise students' sense of belonging and connectedness.

2. Reports from the Academic Committee and Subject Departments

(1) **Academic Affairs**

This was the first year of the three-year Annual School Plan, which aims to enhance academic success among students.

To empower students in navigating the curriculum, teachers consistently acknowledged individual progress, reinforcing confidence and motivation. Departments aligned curriculum content and assessments to ensure coherence and clarity in learning outcomes. Lesson observations-both peer and appraisal- based—focused on addressing diverse learning needs, followed by professional dialogues to refine instructional strategies. Dedicated programmes catered to varied abilities: gifted learners engaged in STEAM projects, Mathematics enrichment classes, and English debate training, while additional support, such as Core Three consolidation classes, helped struggling students bridge gaps. These efforts ensured tailored learning pathways for all.

To build a Strong Academic Foundation for Junior Students, Key Learning Areas (KLAs) integrated subject-specific study techniques. Departments revised homework policies to include tiered assignments and differentiating tasks to match students' readiness levels. Supplementary programmes like Saturday Language Across Curriculum (LaC) classes and Core Three revision sessions equipped students with examination strategies. A highlight was the cross-subject collaboration with the University of Hong Kong, where Mathematics and Geography departments piloted interdisciplinary projects.

All in all, we are pleased to see our students make progress in their academic studies. We will continue to refine our strategies to ensure the progress of students' studies will be better and better.

(2) English Department

The English Department has made remarkable progress during the 2024–25 academic year, with a strong emphasis on curriculum innovation, interdisciplinary collaboration, and student engagement. One of the most notable accomplishments was the successful implementation of the Language across the Curriculum (LaC) strategy in partnership with the University of Hong Kong. This initiative, involving the Mathematics, History, and English departments, has fostered student-centered learning and enhanced motivation in English as a Medium of Instruction (EMI) subjects by applying complex concepts to real-life scenarios. Ten Saturday LaC lessons for S.1 to S.3 were conducted smoothly, co-taught by EMI subject teachers and English panel heads, and received positive feedback for their effectiveness in preparing students for assessments. The department also launched a self-directed online learning platform focused on reading, listening, and vocabulary practice, which achieved high completion rates and earned multiple awards for excellence in digital education. Whole-school English activities such as choral speaking competitions, inter-class debates, and the Reading Pal Scheme flourished, creating a vibrant English-rich environment. Students showcased their learning through presentations and performances, including the English Drama Group's production of "What a Wonderful World." The English Society and Debate Team had active and successful terms, with notable achievements in external competitions. In alignment with the MOI proposal, the department refined LaC worksheets and adjusted language mark allocations to better integrate language learning into EMI subjects. Overall, the department has maintained a strong commitment to enhancing language proficiency through diverse, inclusive, and engaging strategies.

Reflecting on the year's work, the department has successfully implemented several key initiatives while also identifying areas for improvement. The cross-curricular collaboration under the LaC strategy has effectively bridged language and content learning, particularly in Mathematics and History, with students responding positively to interdisciplinary teaching and real-life examples. The self-directed learning platform has seen strong engagement, with over 80% of students completing the tasks, and has earned four prestigious awards recognizing both school-wide and individual teacher achievements. Whole-school activities have created a dynamic English environment, boosting students' confidence and communication skills. Student showcases, including drama performances and presentations, provided creative outlets

for expression and were well-received by the school community. The department has also made progress in refining assessment criteria and aligning curriculum components to better support language development in EMI subjects. However, challenges have persisted. There remains a need for enhanced resources, including systematic study packages, vocabulary lists, and audio recordings to support student learning more effectively. Spelling and vocabulary retention have continued to be areas of concern, particularly in EMI subjects, indicating the need for more targeted interventions. Additionally, curriculum overload has emerged as a challenge, prompting the department to consider trimming or removing certain modules to make room for more engaging and student-centered activities.

Looking ahead to 2025–26, the English Department is committed to building on this year's achievements with refined pedagogies and a renewed focus on student confidence. Teachers will reflect on their personal evaluation reports and align their practices with the department's development plan, while grouping policies will be revised to better meet student needs. Spelling will be a key focus area, with tools like Quizlet introduced to reinforce vocabulary retention. The integration of debate and choral speaking into the formal curriculum will be explored, and thematic mapping across forms will be implemented to help students build on prior knowledge and apply language skills more effectively. The department will thoughtfully incorporate elements from the 2025 Curriculum Framework of National Security Education into English lessons to ensure relevance and engagement. Collaboration with the AI Language Company will continue, with refinements in writing topics and marking criteria, and AI tools such as Microsoft Reading Coach, Quizlet, and TEAMS will be used to enhance writing, listening, speaking, and spelling. Practical training sessions will be held early in the school year to support these initiatives. After-school extended learning classes will be arranged for S.1 to S.6, including LaC sessions cotaught by English and EMI subject teachers, with collaboratively developed revision packages delivered before tests and exams. Literature Appreciation Week and LaC Reading Week will be scheduled, featuring fun and engaging reading activities. The department will also shift toward diversified continuous assessment to support student well-being and align with global trends and EDB guidelines. Choral speaking and debate will remain central to inter-class and inter-school competitions, with the NET providing training for junior forms. The department will monitor the Speech Festival schedule and prepare accordingly. With collaborative planning, strategic refinement, and a commitment to student success, the English Department is well-positioned to make 2025–26 another impactful and inspiring year.

(3) Mathematics Department

To foster students' self-efficacy, the Math Award Scheme and an after-school question-and-answer session, ChatMAT, were introduced. The scheme encouraged students to complete extra exercises, develop a growth mindset, and take ownership of their learning journey. In ChatMAT, students raised questions and engaged in discussions with peers and teachers. Through consistent effort and reflection, students were empowered to grow in both confidence and competence in mathematics.

To cater for learner diversity, a range of differentiated teaching strategies was implemented. These included grouping in S3, tiered assignments to challenge highability students and support those needing more guidance, and individual support to help students overcome learning barriers. With the help of our graduates serving as Math Mentors, enrichment courses were arranged for both less able and high-ability students across different forms.

Collaborative teaching practices were further strengthened this year. Highlights included: S.1 Logical Thinking Lessons in collaboration with HKU, S.2 co-teaching with the English Department, also supported by HKU and STEAM-integrated lessons in S.3. In addition, collaborative planning sessions, peer lesson observations, and department-based professional development sessions were conducted to enhance teaching effectiveness and foster professional growth.

To make mathematics more engaging, a variety of learning activities were organized. On Life-Wide Learning (LWL) Day, S1 students participated in the Math Trail Competition and Rummikub Exploration Activity. During STEAM Week, booth activities focused on encoding and decoding concepts. The Mathematics Society actively organized events such as the Inter-house Mathematics Competition, Monthly Math Challenge, Rummikub Competition, and Sudoku Competition, promoting mathematical thinking and student leadership.

To broaden students' horizons and unleash their potential, members of the Mathematics Teams and Rummikub Team were trained and encouraged to participate in various inter-school competitions. Students took part in 20 competitions, including: 27th Hong Kong Mathematical High Achievers Selection Contest, 42nd Hong Kong

Mathematics Olympiad, Hong Kong Mathematics Kangaroo Contest 2025, International Mathematical Olympiad Preliminary Selection Contest 2025, The Hong Kong Youth Mathematical Challenge, CCC Inter-school Number Combination Game Challenge and CCC Inter-school Rummikub Competition. In total, students earned 94 individual awards and 5 group awards, including: Inter-School Contest Group Merits for S.1, S.2, S.3, and Senior Secondary in MathConceptition and First-Class Honours in the team event of the Thirty-seventh Inter-School Mathematics Contest. These accomplishments reflect students' dedication and excellence in mathematics.

(4) History Department

To enhance teaching and learning effectiveness, various strategies including direct teaching and enquiry learning were implemented in this school year. MOI measures and collaboration with the English Department were conducted to facilitate students' history learning using English. Co-curricular activities were also proposed to unleash students' learning capacity. PSHE week was organized with the cooperation of the department of PSHE KLA. In general, further effort should be made to strengthen students' demonstration of subject knowledge along with organizing learning activities in junior forms.

In short, initiatives to enhance students' academic performance were reviewed regularly and further progress is anticipated in the coming year.

(5) Geography Department

Different cross-curricular activities has been organized for students with the cooperation of other departments and societies. PSHE week was organized with the cooperation of departments of PSHE KLA. S.1 students took part in the Mainland studies tour during Life-wide Learning Day. S.2 students also took part in a quiz activity with the application of different apps, to extend their learning with the cooperation of Life and Society (Junior). S1 to S3 students also enrolled "Chinese Calligraphy Competition (AI living/ Sustainability) Activity which was organized by Geography CT Department and Chinese Department. S.2 and S.3 students also carried out "Basic Law Trip Planning" and "Basic Law Poster Design" to enhance the understanding of Basic Law. S.3 students carried out a water quality survey which was organized by Geography, Biology and Chemistry Departments. S.3 and 4 attended various talks, workshops and competitions such as "Slope Safety Talk", "VR Astronomy Workshop" and "「歷史四维遊」全港中學生活動一香港四「維」遊創

意地圖設計比賽" to extend their learning. S.4 and S.5 students also attended a field trip which was about the coastal environment of Cheung Chau to strengthen their field work skills. They also took part in "Environmental Conservation Writing Competition" and "See Green Go Green Travelogue Contest".

(6) <u>Integrated Science Department</u>

The department facilitated students' understanding of the nature of science and the acquisition of science process skills. By implementing various learning activities, students were nurtured to increase their interest, and to enhance their understanding of scientific knowledge. Besides, the department also advocated for them to make informed decisions about science-related issues in their daily life. Students' awareness of national security was also raised through the teaching and learning practices.

In order to enhance students' problem-solving skills and creativity while learning science, four small-scale STEAM activities were conducted in regular classroom settings this year. Meanwhile, two STEAM workshops related to Smart City and Environmental Science was held for S.1-3 students in STEAM week and a Project Learning (Cross-subjects) related to the design of a mobile app to serve the community was conducted in S.2.

Furthermore, students with good potential were nominated to join various inter-school competitions. Six S.2 students were nominated to join the International Junior Science Olympiad 2025. One S.2 student participated in the Solar car charging competition in 2025 organized by the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers - electrical division. Nine S.1-2 students also participated in the "Science in Cha Chaan Teng Food" Writing Competition in 2025 organized by the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Students got valuable experience in the Science related competitions.

(7) **Physics Department**

Our S.3 students engaged in a series of activities designed to cultivate their interest in physics. A highlight was an in-class STEAM activity where students were tasked with designing and constructing a periscope. Given two small mirrors, they delved into researching the principles of how a periscope works and its inherent limitations. Further challenges encouraged them to innovate, such as modifying their designs to enable rearward vision. The students found this practical exploration highly enjoyable.

For S.4 and S.5, a study tour to Ocean Park provided a unique learning experience. Students explored the thrilling rides at Thrill Mountain, identifying and analyzing the underlying physics concepts. They then channeled their academic knowledge and personal experiences from the rides into designing their own exciting and safe ride models.

Through these immersive experiences, students gained a deeper understanding of how their classroom learning translates into real-world applications.

(8) Chemistry Department

Various activities were held to enrich students' learning experience. Seven S4 students demonstrated hands-on experiments to P6 students and their parents on Information Day. Forty S.3 students participated in the cross-subject activity to analyze the quality of seawater at Tsing Yi Pier. During STEAM Week, an investigation of the alcohol contents in different drinks using colorimetry was arranged for about thirty S.3 students. Another STEAM activity, the making of scented candles, was also successfully conducted for all S.3 students.

Students also actively participated in activities organized by external organizations. Four S.4 and S.5 students attempted to investigate the calcium contents in different samples of soy milk using techniques of titration in Chemistry Olympiad. A total of 13 S.4-S.6 students participated in the Analytical Chemistry Challenge for Secondary Students.

For the above competitions, although our students did not attain outstanding results, the experience of investigating authentic issues was valuable to them. Besides that, our S.4 and S.5 students also actively participated in the Chemist Online Self-study Award Scheme and the International Chemistry Quiz (ICQ).

(9) **Biology Department**

The Biology Department provides various learning experiences that enable students to develop scientific literacy, so that they can participate actively in the changing knowledge-based society, prepare for further studies in the fields related to life science, and become lifelong learners in biological science. Students also raised their

awareness of national security through the teaching and learning practices. Students' awareness of national security was also raised through the teaching and learning practices.

Students with good academic performance in Biology were nominated to join the inter-school STEAM competition. Four S.5 students were selected to participate in the PolyU SCIENCE Young Talents Competition 2024/25 organized by The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Additionally, eight S.5 students were nominated to join the Hong Kong Biology Literacy Award 2024/2025 organized by the H.K. Association for Science and Mathematics Education. One student was granted a 'Merit'. Through these challenges, our elite students got valuable experience and their horizons were broadened.

Not only were elite students catered to, but opportunities were given to average students to serve as helpers during Open Day for P6 parents and students. Interesting experiments were demonstrated and a number of interesting models were exhibited. The performance of student helpers in explaining related biological concepts was good and a satisfactory response was observed from the guests.

(10) Economics Department

To promote self-regulated learning, error books were used across all classes to highlight students' misconceptions and mistakes. QR codes linking to concept-related videos were attached to the worksheets of each chapter to facilitate self-learning and revision.

To enhance teaching and learning effectiveness, various grouping strategies were implemented in S.4 and S.5. Discussion and study groups were formed to promote peer support in learning. Extended learning programme, such as a visit to the Hong Kong Monetary Authority (HKMA), was organized for S.2 elite students and S.5 students after completing the topic "Money and Banking." S.4 and S.5 students also participated in a school tour of Lingnan University and attended the thematic talk "Lingnan Masterclass Series: Unlocking Economics" by Prof. Gary Wong. Additionally, S.5 students joined the Statistical Talk organized by the Census and Statistics Department, which covered topics such as the Consumer Price Index (CPI), Gross Domestic Product (GDP), and Balance of Payments (BoP).

To cater to learner diversity, S.4 and S.5 students participated in the Economic Infographic Challenge (2024/25), organized by the Education Bureau (EDB) in collaboration with the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), the Department of Industrial and Systems Engineering at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU), and the Hong Kong Association for Economics Education.

To enrich students' learning experiences in authentic, subject-related professional contexts, selected S.4 students joined the HSBC "Future Skills" Youth Pilot Programme (匯豐「未來家」青年先導計劃). They participated in career-sharing sessions, visited HSBC headquarters, and organized social service activities for the underprivileged during the summer vacation.

(11) Computer and Creative Technology Department

The C&CT Department is committed to promoting student engagement in Information Technology by offering a wide range of opportunities for exploration and skill development. In response to the rapid advancement of technology, we provide students with access to a variety of IT services, courses, and competitions designed to broaden their knowledge and enhance their technical abilities.

Students gain practical experience through diverse programming tools, including micro:bit, mBOT, mobile app development with youCodia, game design with Game Factory, and VR programming in the Metaverse using CoSpaces. These tools are integrated into lessons that emphasize inquiry, programming, and problem-solving. This approach enables students to apply theoretical concepts to real-world situations, fostering both critical thinking and creativity.

A key focus of our department is to cultivate innovation and promote the practical application of design principles. Through Design & Technology projects such as 3D models Design, the 4-Foot Walking Machine, and the Robot Finger with micro:bit, students develop valuable hands-on skills and gain experience in solving complex problems through technology. These projects not only build technical competence but also strengthen students' craftsmanship and project-based learning abilities.

This year, we actively contributed to English Week and STEAM Week by setting up interactive booths that showcased IT and AI-related knowledge. These events aimed

to spark student interest in emerging AI technologies and help them understand how AI supports humans in various aspects of life.

Additionally, our department led a school-based STEAM project for S.2 students, focusing on computational thinking and coding. This initiative equipped students with essential digital-age skills. We also collaborated with other departments, such as BAFS, Mathematics, and Integrated Science, to promote cross-curricular learning. This approach has enriched students' educational experiences and encouraged broader, more connected thinking.

(12) **BAFS Department**

To facilitate students' self-efficacy and learning outcomes, twenty-five S.5 students joined the Project Morals & Money (Project M²) Program. It offered a life-skills platform with a structured and engaging learning journey in financial quotient (FQ) and morals education. It was aimed to encourage students to develop good financial habits and positive mindsets, allowing them to achieve financial well-being.

In addition, three students with good academic performance in BAFS were nominated to join the M²Leadership Program. The program was designed to connect enthusiastic and gifted students with influential business leaders in Hong Kong. It offered an inperson experience that would inspire and empower students through keynote speeches and seminars.

To enhance students' exposure to the latest trends in business, twelve BAFS students participated in the "Greater Bay Area Career Exploration Exchange Tour", coorganized with the Career and Cultural Exchange Committee. The tour aimed to help students understand recent business developments and collaborations between Hong Kong and Greater Bay Area cities. It gave students first-hand exposure to diverse industries, actual workplaces and the entrepreneurial environment.

(13) Physical Education Department

To mobilize students' participation in physical activities so as to meet WHO's recommendation on MVPA60, the following strategies are implemented in this year:

- ♣ Sport for All in February
- ♣ Let's move together in GYM Room

- **↓** Let's move at Home (Robot Coach Exercise)
- **♣** Sport and Health Talk

To further engage students in developing an active and healthy lifestyle, our basketball team has joined the Community Chest Slam Dunk Challenge 2024-25. The Campaign offers basketball training and tournaments as well as social service opportunities. The program emphasizes the development of sportsmanship, team spirit, endurance and self-confidence in young people.

Also, Bowling Class is launched in February which sponsored by "General Air-conditioning". Students will then join the CCC Bowling Competition in May.

Inter-house sports competitions were held throughout the year. The 55th School Anniversary Athletic Meet was completed in December. More than 400 students participated in the competition, and about 150 students serviced in the Sport Days. Students' perseverance and a positive attitude were being cultivated. Students with different abilities can also contribute to participating in the competition, as we believe in "SPORTS FOR ALL, HEALTH FOR ALL".

(14) Library

To cultivate students' interest and habits in reading, the Cross-Subject (LAC) Reading Scheme was implemented in S1–3 to promote the learning of English through reading. The Extensive Reading Scheme was implemented in S.1–5 to encourage students to initiate their own learning progress. Moreover, library tours and reading lessons were conducted for S1 students to help them adapt to an English and e-learning environment, with S4 English Reading Ambassadors serving as mentors. Three S.5 students were awarded Harvard Book Prizes in recognition of their outstanding reading achievements and shared their reading and learning habits with student librarians.

To integrate virtual reality (VR) and e-Learning into language education. Students were encouraged to do their SBA or reading reports with various ebooks from our online library (eclass plus), Britannica and VR equipment (e.g. VR headsets) to enhance the effectiveness of learning.

To foster a reading culture, a variety of activities were organized. We arranged a small-

scale book exhibition about "Kowloon Walled City" and invited the original author – Yu Yi (余兒) to deliver an assembly talk. Also, we had an S.4 Chinese writing skills conducted by another author – Zisha (紫砂). In addition, we had a Reading Week with various game booths to promote reading with fun. Students participated in a range of competitions (e.g. Creative Sentence Writing Competition) and activities (e.g. Our Joyful Reading Days 2024).

To explore the world through reading, local and overseas cultural tours were expected to be worthwhile. "Wenchang Aerospace Science Popularization Base Study Program" and "Xi'an and Yan'an Historical and Intangible Cultural Heritage Exploration" Exchange Tour aim to enhance students to widen their global exposure and broaden their horizons. The activities encourage students to "read the world and understand our society", illustrating those books not only recounting past events, but also stories of personal life experience.

The following subjects were taught in Chinese.

(15) 中國語文科

初、高中單元教學,旨在提高學生讀寫聽說能力、思維能力、審美能力和 自學能力,培養他們品德、良好的學習態度和習慣,加強其對社群的責任感。 老師通過不同的分組活動,讓學生積極參與、敢於表達和樂於學習。

學校著重學生寫作能力的培養,本學年引入人工智能批改作文,為部分級別學生批改作文,再根據人工智能系統的意見和學生討論、分析要改善的地方。此外,為了提高學生的寫作興趣,加強他們觀察力和感官描寫的能力,今年中一至中三各班更安排戶外寫作活動。由老師按寫作題目的要求規劃行程,再分班,甚至分組帶學生走到不同的地方——公園、街市、屋邨——實地考察,務求讓學生有真實的體會,完成自己的作文練習,提升他們的能力和信心。

拔尖補底方面,我們邀請中一至中五各級語文尖子參加閱讀寫作班,通過評賞優秀的文學作品,提升學生的文學閱讀品味,啟發創意思維,及提升寫作興趣。學校更籌辦「上海蘇州文學行」及「走在文學的港灣」(文學散步),以拓闊學生視野。除照顧尖子外,為鞏固學生中文科知識,學校更增設課後溫習班,以照顧學生學習的多樣性。

延伸學生學習課時亦是我們重點工作之一,我們鼓勵學生參與電子閱讀計劃,提升學生語文自學能力。

聯課活動方面,我們推薦及指導學生參加不同形式校內、校外比賽及語文活動,讓學生有更多元的學習經歷。

(16) 普通話科

本科透過聆聽、說話、閱讀和拼寫四個學習範疇,培養學生普通話口語溝通能力,以及學習本科的興趣、態度和習慣。聆聽和說話的學習,要求學生能聽能說,能準確地理解和表達,以滿足學習、生活和日後工作的需要。閱讀和拼寫的學習,注重語言的積累,語感和自學能力的培養,以輔助聆聽和說話的學習。

另外,本科組織各種學習活動,例如猜謎語、講故事、角色扮演、做遊戲、 聽廣播、朗讀、朗誦、報告、討論及比賽。通過以學生為中心的教學設計,使 學生愉快地學習,把所學的語言技能運用於實際生活中。在推廣普通話工作上, 本科推動學生參加校際朗誦節比賽及推行每週一次的早會宣佈,並設有學生 分享環節,以普通話進行時事、書籍及故事的分享。而在校內舉行普通話日活 動中,透過普通話攤位遊戲、短劇表演及壁佈等,延展課堂所學。藉著以上種 種活動,務使學生取得良好的學習效果。

(17) 中國歷史科

科任老師致力設計多元化的課業,舉辦各類活動,以符合不同同學的學習需要。透過循序漸進的方式引導學生融入學習生活,鼓勵他們積極參與,建立正面價值觀,提升國民身份認同感,強化國家觀念,培養對中國歷史的驕傲感以及對香港及國家的歸屬感。

在國民教育方面,本年度主題為「國慶·校慶齊賀;文物·文化同尋」,本組成功安排同學參與各種延展活動,包括:「祖國昌盛 歡慶滿城」中華人民共和國成立七十五周年巡迴展覽 及「賀國慶問答比賽」、中一級「齊賀國慶」明信片設計比賽、中二級「龍情暖意賀國慶 75 周年」中國剪紙賀卡設計比賽、中三級「祖國昌盛・國富民強・齊賀國慶」海報設計比賽、墨寶獻「壽」賀國慶・校慶一書法工作坊、2025《憲法》及《基本法》全港校際問答比賽、參觀選舉資訊中心、中二級「《憲法》及《基本法》標語設計比賽」、中一及中三

級《憲法》及《基本法》大熊貓小印記:紀念品設計比賽。同時,本校參與教育局舉辦的《憲法》及《基本法》學生校園大使計劃,共有30位來自中二至中五的同學參與。該計劃為同學提供不同機會,讓他們認識並協助推廣《憲法》、《基本法》及國家安全等訊息。

在師生共同努力下,本校獲得了以下殊榮:教育局「傳承·想創——積極推廣中國歷史與中華文化學校嘉許獎」及「積極推廣中國歷史與中華文化教師獎」以及學生獲得「積極學習中國歷史與中華文化獎」;教育局《憲法》及《基本法》學生校園大使培訓計劃「積極籌辦校本活動獎」;教育局舉辦的「香港特別行政區成立周年紀念日」攝影比賽——3A 韓瑩瑩獲得冠軍的殊榮;教育局舉辦的「歷史四維遊」網上閱讀獎勵計劃,普及版方面分別有 2 位同學獲得 優異獎、20 位同學獲得嘉許獎;至於挑戰版方面分別有 4 位同學獲得優異獎、1 位同學獲得嘉許獎。此外,本校更榮獲「推廣閱讀文化獎」。

至於內地交流團方面,本科組安排 10 位同學參加「慶祝中華人民共和國成立 75 周年,荃葵青學界高鐵大灣區交流活動(葵青民政事務處)」。以及安排修讀中國歷史科的中四同學參加「北京、石家莊歷史及傳統文化探索之旅(教育局)」。本科組也推薦同學參加由民政及青年事務局和青年發展委員會資助的內地交流團,地點包括內蒙古、黑龍江、吉林、北京等。希望透過這些活動,提升學生對自身民族的自信心和自豪感,進而建立國民身份認同,豐富生活的內涵。

(18) 宗教教育科

本科藉著課堂向學生傳遞基督信仰知識,並以聖經為基礎,幫助學生建立正面價值觀。透過各式活動,包括各級的聖經金句實踐計劃、讀經計劃及電影生命教育,鼓勵學生反思生命及實踐基督教信仰。本科又與宗教組及校牧合作,鼓勵同學參與全完堂教育主日、學校團契及各項福音活動等,讓同學從多方面接觸信仰。本年度在各班邀請及組織福音關懷大使,年中與小火子機構合辦進行多次培訓工作坊,製作中一祝福小禮包。另外科組亦推動中五同學寫下祝福及金句(加力仔),鼓勵中六同學勇敢面對公開考試。

在活動方面,本科與視藝科合作舉辦初中以宗教為題的平面設計比賽,視覺藝術科利用課堂教導同學簡報設計,讓同學發揮藝術天份之餘,更多認識聖經章節。此外,亦嘗試在各級進行「讀經計劃——加拉太書」,培養同學讀經的習慣,從而增加同學在課餘接觸聖經知識的機會,提升學校宗教氣氛。

(19) 視覺藝術科

今年同學參加了一些校外比賽及領袖訓練活動。5B文禧媽同學在「香港心臟基金會繪畫比賽」獲得精英獎、5A何諾依同學獲得優異獎;3A黃正同學在第一屆非遺長衫(旗袍)設計比賽獲得優異獎,3A崔峻晞同學、3A劉穎蓉同學、5A何諾依同學、5D朱曉盈同學及5D施安琪同學獲得入圍獎;5D周殷彤同學及5A宋嘉宇同學在「喜氣洋洋在全完」親子利是封創作比賽分別獲得冠軍及季軍,而1C鄭穎芯同學及1A余曉贇同學則同獲優異獎。

4D 歐陽諾妍同學參與第十八屆文化新人類——青年領袖獎勵計劃 2024; 4A 張霏同學及 4C 姜心愛同學參與香港藝術發展局第十屆「校園學生藝術大 使計劃」。

(20) 音樂科

透過音樂科,讓學生獲得豐富的學習經歷。課堂內,學生參與創作、聆聽、 歌唱及樂器演奏等活動。課堂外,學生參加不同的音樂活動,如中西樂器訓練 班、手鈴隊、中西樂團、合唱團及工作坊等。

(21) 生活與社會科

本科積極配合其他個人、社會及人文教育學習領域的科目,教學重點內容涵蓋個人與群性發展、資源與經濟活動及社會體系與公民精神,讓學生在相關的學習領域有整全的學習。同時透過「同根同心」-佛山的嶺南文化考察及PSHE 週的問答活動,進一步加強同學對學科內容的認識。

在國家安全及基本法教育的推行方面,本科安排充足的課時讓學生認識 基本法,並配以不同課堂活動、校際問答及國安短片比賽,提升學生對相關內容的了解。

本科亦積極策劃及設計電子學習教材,透過不同類型的教學活動增加課堂的互動。本科亦鼓勵學生參與不同的校內活動,如博聞盃及校外比賽,如國家安全、憲法與基本法網上問答比賽。

(22) 公民與社會發展科

本科強調幫助學生了解香港、國家及當代世界的狀況,以及其多元化和互相依存的特質。我們課程的設計原則在建立同學應有的知識、技能、價值觀和態度。為此,科任老師致力製作多項適切教材,配合同學的學習需要及滿足本科的教學宗旨。

在基本法及國安教育的推行方面,本科安排國安展館參觀及「中華文化及 民族自信」講座,並配以教育局舉辦的不同校際問答、短講及國安短片製作比 賽,以提升同學對相關內容的了解程度。多次比賽均見同學的踴躍參與。

本科著重同學的親身體驗,中五同學參加了教育局安排的中山珠海非遺保育考察團。本校亦安排了同學參與西安文化考察團,本科亦親自策劃廣州生態文化及歷史考察。本地考察團則參觀了大坑火龍館,同時體驗了舞火龍及製作龍鬚糖。以上活動皆為同學提供了解及欣賞中華文化的機會。

本校社會科學學會支援公民與社會發展科學習。當中的博聞盃社際問答 比賽協助同學連繫各科學習,亦更深入了解國家安全的知識。另外,學會和科 組舉辦各項學習延展活動:織草蜢、製作糖畫、炸賀年角仔、繪製小巴牌、國 安問答比賽等,各項都大大增加同學對本科的學習興趣。

(23) 國民教育組及國家安全教育組

本校國民教育組採取「多重進路」及課堂內外互相配合的形式,致力將國民教育普及化,藉有系統的學習和舉辦多元化的跨組或跨科活動,培養學生的國家觀念、國民身份認同和民族自豪感。依循「認識自我,立足香港,背靠祖國,面向世界」的方向,學生能體驗及實踐正面價值觀及態度,並樂於關顧家人、服務社會,認識自己的國民身份,願意為國家及民眾謀福祉,致力貢獻國家及世界,建立積極人生的信念,讓國家的優良傳統、中華文化薪火相傳下去。

國家安全教育是學校教育一個重要元素。香港特別行政區是中華人民共和國不可分離的部分。維護國家安全是香港特別行政區的憲制責任,也是所有香港居民的共同義務。本校國安教育小組除致力幫助學生認識國家的最新發展,加強國民身份認同,亦致力向學生解釋國家安全相關的概念、《香港國安法》的立法背景、內容及意義等,確保學生能獲得正確的資訊,清晰了解及正確解讀《香港國安法》,理解國家安全的重要性,正確認識香港特別行政區的憲制地位和「一國兩制」的基本原則。我們更不斷提醒教職員和學生遵守法律,加強防範和制止任何人士在學校進行任何違反《基本法》、《香港國安法》和所有適用於香港的法律的教學和活動,以免干擾學校的正常運作及影響學生學習,並致力培養學生尊重法治的精神,成為守法的良好國民和公民,共同維護國家的安全。

IV Support for Student Development

1. Religious Affairs

The Religious Committee plans and organises religious activities in the school. The committee works in close collaboration with the CCC Chuen Yuen Church and the School Chaplain and they are actively involved in our gospel activities.

This year, the theme of the Monday Morning Devotion was 'Benevolence, Empathy, Respect for Others, Filial Piety, Integrity, Law-abidingness, Diligence, Perseverance' which were the priority values and attitudes of Values Education promoted by Education Bureau. Bible verses and messages related to the theme were chosen and shared by the teachers and School Chaplain. Gospel and Caring Ambassadors and committee members of the Student Christian Fellowship joined the training sessions organized by the Little Fire limited. They were trained up and encouraged to serve others. Regular meetings of the Student Christian Fellowship were held on Friday and student disciples were involved in leading the meetings with the help of teacher advisors and the School Chaplain. Prayer meetings, religious cell group meetings and teacher fellowship meetings were held regularly. Various activities were organised during Gospel week and external organisations and guests were invited to hold gospel meetings and religious assemblies. It was hoped that our students would share the love of Jesus Christ and become His disciples.

2. Discipline Committee

Our students were self-disciplined and positive about their school life. The campus order was good and the number of violations to school rules remained low. Our discipline teachers, other colleagues and prefects contributed a lot in maintaining an orderly and harmonious school environment.

To cultivate our students with positive values and attitudes, various tasks were done. The training of monitors was held in collaboration with the Guidance Committee and the SEN Team. Adventure training for junior form students and prefects was arranged to enhance their self-confidence, leadership and team spirit. An interclass quiz competition was held to deliver messages of being 'law-abiding' and having 'integrity'. Six students attained a silver award in the ICAC iTeen Leader Programme and they helped a lot in organising activities (including a virtual visit to ICAC, microfilm watching and a quiz competition) for other students.

Students were encouraged to achieve their goals by joining the Demerit Offset Scheme and completing more demanding discipline-related items of the Chuen Yuen All-Round Award Scheme (CYARAS). The number of successful applications in CYARAS has significantly increased while some students needed more encouragement and guidance to offset their demerits.

3. Guidance Committee

The Guidance Committee, in collaboration with school social workers from the Hong Kong Christian Service and the educational psychologist from CCC, is responsible for the planning and implementation of student counselling services.

In alignment with one of the key foci of the Annual School Plan, "Achieving goals with perseverance" the Committee collaborated with other committees to develop and implement classroom management strategies. Furthermore, sex education lessons were effectively delivered across all year levels. A whole-school game booth activity was also organized to foster a "caring culture" and promote positive values such as love and thanksgiving, which was well received by all participants.

The Committee also focused on raising students' awareness of mental health. Systematic emotional education was integrated into MCED lessons on an ongoing basis, and a mental health education assembly was introduced for students. A partnership with the Hong Kong Youth Association enabled the provision of a series of therapy workshops for junior form students. A mental health support group was established to provide a safe environment where participants could share their stresses with understanding, acceptance, and empathy.

Additionally, the Mental Health of Parents & Students (One-off Grant) was utilized to organize various activities aimed at strengthening students' awareness of their peers' mental well-being. Students were encouraged to acknowledge and develop a healthy relationship with their mental health.

To enhance students' problem-solving skills, leadership potential, and self-confidence, concerted efforts were made through collaborative initiatives. These included a training programme for junior form class monitors and adventure-based counselling programmes, both of which yielded commendable student performance.

Our school social workers, Miss Cindy Chan and Mr. Alex So, provided quality support to students, assisting in their personal growth—particularly in overcoming learning difficulties and fostering harmonious family relationships. They designed leaflets for

parents addressing the physical and mental changes students experience during the transition from Primary 6 to Secondary 1, and were available to address parental concerns via telephone. For both junior and senior form students, they offered effective stress-relief strategies to encourage a positive mindset towards examinations and to provide students with activities for improving interpersonal relationships. Small souvenirs were distributed as ongoing encouragement, and an Instagram platform maintained by the team gained popularity among students.

A whole-school approach was adopted to support students with special educational needs (SEN). Those with learning difficulties were identified and referred to specialists for diagnosis and follow-up. Individualized education plans, assessment accommodations, and a range of training and activities were provided to cater to their needs.

In response to our students' needs, we will collaborate with Jockey Club Tour Heart+ this year to implement a school-wide "Early Identification Scheme for Individuals at Risk of Mental Health Issues." Appropriate support will then be provided based on the specific needs identified.

We would like to express our gratitude to Mr. Chow Tze Chung, the educational psychologist, and other professionals for their valuable support in the above endeavours.

4. Career Guidance Affairs

The Careers Committee organized a wide range of career planning activities for all students throughout the year. The Committee collaborated with organizations such as St. James' Settlement, The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, HKU SPACE, CityU SCOPE, Lingnan University, the Hong Kong Welfare Society, Hong Kong Community College, the Hong Kong Association of Careers Masters and Guidance Masters, as well as other local and overseas institutions of further education to deliver life planning education and career guidance programmes.

This year, the Committee extended life planning activities to junior forms. These included self-understanding and goal-setting lessons in S.1, and financial management and life planning activities in S.2. S.1 students participated in the programme 「生涯起動」organized by St. James' Settlement under the Funding Scheme for Youth Life Planning Activities 2022-25. Meanwhile, S.2 students joined the financial management programme 「二次人生理財及生涯規劃活動」organized by the Hong Kong Welfare Society. In this programme, S.2 students were grouped into simulated "families" to

experience decision-making and planning in areas such as daily life, work, further education, savings, and consumption. These activities aimed to emphasize the importance of financial literacy, life planning, and goal setting. To broaden students' global perspectives, the Committee partnered with the Academy of Baptist Convention of Hong Kong to organize a Japanese taster programme for S.2 and S.3 students. Through this programme, students explored Japanese culture and lifestyle, thereby expanding their international outlook.

Senior form students also participated in a variety of career-related courses and programmes. Selected S.5 students enrolled in the Applied Learning course "Creative English – PR and Marketing", held on Saturday mornings. S6 students (cohort 2023–2025) completed the Applied Learning course "Vocational English – English for Service Professionals". A total of 29 students enrolled in the course and applied for the HKDSE. Of these, 26 students (89.66%) fulfilled the attendance requirement. Three students (10.34%) attained "Attained with Distinction II" and twelve students (41.38%) attained "Attained with Distinction I".

The "Career Live" workshops provided S.4 students with opportunities to explore various industries through taster programmes in aviation services, e-sports and engineering, advertising media, and the healthcare sector. S.5 students participated in the Education and Career Expo 2025. In addition, elite students with a strong interest in the hospitality industry visited Hotel ICON, where they gained insights into the School of Hotel and Tourism Management at PolyU. The "My Life Planning Portfolio" was introduced to senior form students to support their personal development. The portfolio helps students better understand themselves through career assessment tools, create personal development plans, set and revise goals through reflection, and explore various academic and career pathways. This initiative equips students with the skills and knowledge to make informed decisions regarding their future studies or careers. Furthermore, mock release of HKDSE result and non-JUPAS admission talks were organized for S.6 students. All events received positive feedback and were well received by participants.

5. Extra-curricular Activities Committee

The Extracurricular Activities Committee organizes various training and activities to enrich students' learning experience and instill positive values and attitudes such as collaborative problem solving and perseverance.

Leadership Training

We focus on training our students to be "Chuen Yuen Leaders." Thus, this year, different Leadership training courses for Class, Club, and House committee members were held to prepare them how to be a Leader.

Our senior student leaders joined the Outward Bound Training to equip better for future. This 4-days 3-nights journey aims to provide an opportunity to work with others; develop confidence by taking up more accountability; learn about the natural consequences of their actions. Their skills were strengthened and became more responsible, motivated, and capable leaders when they return to school.

All form three students attended an overnight Camp at HKAYP Jockey Club Duke of Edinburgh Training in December. 2-day training required participants to communicate with each other and have good teamwork. The camp unleashed the creativity and potential of young individuals.

Houses

We have four Houses named from the Bible: Wisdom, Faith, Hope, and Love. Each house comprises staff and students from all year levels. Students are encouraged to participate in a range of house competitions. We also stress building a sense of identity and belonging, which helps foster school spirit.

Clubs and Society

Our school offers sixteen elite teams, twenty clubs and societies covering academic, religious, service, interest, and sports categories. This allows students to enjoy a diverse range of extracurricular activities and enrich their learning experiences. Their talents are unleashed, and their potential is stretched. Students learn from success or failure through systematic training or competition. We have certainly produced a fruitful school year and hope to provide a fruitful life for them continuously.

6. Moral and Civic Education Committee

This year, the Moral and Civic Education Committee (MCED) prioritized values education, fostering positive values and a healthy outlook on life among students through a whole-school approach. A series of activities aligned with the MCED Committee's theme - 'To nurture students to be future leaders of the society!' were organized to reinforce this mission.

To further strengthen students' positive values and attitudes including 12 priority values

and attitudes, two adventure training programs were conducted for S.1 and S.4 students. Tasks were intentionally designed to be challenging, combining indoor and outdoor activities such as high-wall climbing. The main goals were achieved — enhancing students' ability of self-understanding, communication and collaboration, encouraging creativity and resetting life goals in the adventure games.

To further develop students to be community contributors, engaged in both school and community activities with a strong sense of belonging and devotion, the elderly service project with the Social Service Department was launched for all forms this academic year. Through the development of elderly life through the elderly, they entered the campus to use 'art workshops' to care for the pressure of students. While learning interactively with them, they could also 'live happily in the elderly', thereby strengthening the intergenerational coexistence between young people and the elderly. We organized inclusive activities to connect students with elders, teach community elders new interests together, and visit community elders together to unleash new dynamics in the community, for example, fun days and visits.

To promote national education and to help students develop a sense of belonging to the country, an affection to the Chinese people and enhance their sense of national identity, four mainland exchange tours were organized, namely, 'Dongguan social service and cultural exchange tour', 'Shenzhen social service and cultural exchange tour', 'Hangzhou Sister School exchange tour' and 'Mongolia Sister School exchange tour'. Collaboration with sister schools included administrative sharing, classroom observations, and student immersion programs, enhancing teachers' professional development and broadening students' horizons. On the other hand, regular national flagraising ceremonies and 'Talks Under the National Flag' at our school further instilled patriotism and civic pride.

To sum up, the positive values nurtured in students' minds have not only helped them develop a healthier life perspective and a more positive learning attitude, but also equipped them with the adaptability required in their future workplace. It is hoped that being positive and responsible citizens, our students will make the world a better place.

7. Whole School Approach to Integrated Education

The school's Student Support Team is run under the supervision of the vice principal incharge of student affairs and led by a SENCO. Other members include a SEN teacher, class teachers and subject teachers of the students with SEN. Working with the

Academic Committee, Discipline Committee, Guidance Committee and Examinations Team, the Student Support Team offers cross-functional support to SEN students; and if necessary, school social workers, educational psychologists and other professionals provide assistance. There is a speech therapist stationed at our school this year and this service offers further support to students with special education needs.

Based on professional advice and with the consent of parents, the school considers the learning needs of students with SEN. Example include: social skills training; speech therapy; reading and writing training; integration activities, and adjustments to assessments. The school has utilised various grants such as the Learning Support Grant to provide support for SEN students. Personalised study plans were also formulated for individual students. Various talks and workshops were held for parents and teachers in order to strengthen the support for students with SEN. The members of the Student Support Team communicated and collaborated closely with parents to understand the needs of the students. The team also invited parents, teachers and other professionals to meetings and interviews to discuss students' progress and gather opinions, which, if necessary, were passed on to the relevant groups for follow-up.

8. Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students

The school encourages and supports the early integration of non-Chinese speaking (NCS) students. NCS students' learning of Chinese is facilitated through adaptation to the local education system. Recognized Chinese assessments are arranged for and taken by NCS students according to their needs. In order to provide educational support, the school has spent the Enhancing Support for Learning and Teaching Chinese for Non-Chinese Speaking Students Funding in various aspects. The school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese, providing after-school support programmes in learning Chinese, and organizing cultural integration activities.

10. Alumni Association

The Thirtieth Annual General Meeting was held on 26th October 2024 and the Election of Alumni Manger of the Incorporated Management Committee 25-27 was completed. The 55th Anniversary Dinner was held by the Alumni Association on 30th November 2024, in which more than 400 teachers and alumni enjoyed the activities related.

The alumni offered over seventy scholarships of about a hundred thousand dollars to students with outstanding performances in academic work, services, or activities. During this year, four newsletters concerning the Election of Alumni Manger of the Incorporated Management Committee, the AGM and the hiking activity, and the ball games were published. Three directors' meetings were held to discuss the alumni affairs.

11. Cultural Exchange Committee

To promote cultural understanding and appreciation among students, we organized various cultural exchange programs and held sharing sessions during the assembly on 12 May. In order to foster cultural awareness, we organize and coordinate local, mainland, and overseas cultural exchange tours for student

The Mainland Cultural Exchange Tours aimed to strengthen exchanges in various fields between young people from the mainland and Hong Kong. From 23 to 25 October (Life Wide Learning Day), eighty S.2 students joined the EDB's "Passing the Torch: Shenzhen Youth Voluntary Public Service, Culture, Science, and Technology Exchange Program," which enhanced students' understanding of community service in China. From 15 to 17 December, six students participated in the "Wenchang Aerospace Science Popularization Base Study Program," enriching their knowledge of the development of aerospace technology in China.

To enhance students' sense of national identity and their understanding of Chinese history and culture, ten students joined the EDB's "Passing the Torch: Xi'an and Yan'an Historical and Intangible Cultural Heritage Exploration" during the Easter holiday. In addition, the Hong Kong Youth Tour to Qinghai enabled students to gain a deeper understanding of Qinghai's culture and geological features.

The Never Give Up Association 2025 DSE Mediterranean Sea Tour aims to provide students with opportunities to broaden their international perspectives and support personal development. Two S.6 students participated in the NGUA training program and exchange tour, visiting various destinations around the Mediterranean Sea. The tour allowed students to experience Mediterranean culture and try unique sea-based lifestyles.

12. Energy Saving Team

To promote awareness of sustainable development, various environmental activities were organized. In order to improve participation and communication among all school personnel regarding energy conservation and green policies, we focused on reducing energy consumption, improving efficiency, and promoting sustainable practices throughout the school.

A Solar Energy Generation System was installed, accompanied by educational activities and workshops. Our school participated in the Solar Harvest – Solar Energy Support

Scheme provided by the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department (EMSD). In addition, we made full use of the installed system to promote environmental education through our participation in the Feed-in Tariff (FiT) Scheme.

To broaden students' horizons, Energy Saving Ambassadors participated in the EDB's "Achieving Carbon Neutrality Student Ambassador Training Scheme 2024/25." The scheme enhanced their understanding of climate change and carbon neutrality through diversified learning activities (e.g. Workshops exploring green architecture and coral conservation under climate change). Four of the ambassadors were awarded certificates of merit for their outstanding performance in practicing a low-carbon lifestyle and their commitment to environmental protection.
